The SAFE Coalition brings together key community partners in an effort to promote education, prevention and treatment for Substance Abuse Disorder. SAFE seeks to bring innovative educational programming along with support and treatment services to our community. One of our initiatives to bring critical services to those that need them most is the SAFE Drop-in Center.

Currently, barriers to treatment and supportive services for those with Substance Abuse Disorder is can be almost insurmountable. The lack of easily obtainable information on how to navigate the system combined with a shortage of treatment beds and financial obstacles make it difficult at best for people to access quality care.

SAFE seeks to reduce these barriers to treatment with a new initiative, the SAFE Drop-in Centers.

Currently in development the centers will be located in the towns of Milford and Franklin and will offer access to treatment and support services for those impacted by substance abuse disorder. Each center will be open twice per month and will provide those seeking help with the following;

- Mental health and substance abuse intake screening by mental health counselor professionals
- Mental health and substance abuse consultations with professional counselor
- Access to outpatient levels of care
- Access to inpatient medical detoxification programs,
- Information on and access to inpatient substance abuse rehabilitation services
- Addiction Recovery services support available through a MOAR representative
- Resources for family support
- Recovery Community “Angel” volunteer support and mentoring
- Faith-based support
- On-site training on the proper use of nasal Naloxone for family members/loved ones of persons with SUDs.
- Information on obtaining nasal Naloxone (NARCAN) for “at-risk” population and those with SUDs
